

# Pro Soccer Coming to San Francisco's Kezar Stadium

The neighborhood already knew it was coming, but today, a group of entrepreneurs officially announced their plans for a new soccer team—the San Francisco Deltas—and its new venue, Kezar Stadium.

"The team intends to join the North American Soccer League (NASL), an alternate league to Major League Soccer (MLS)," the press release states. "[It] will compete in the U.S. Open Cup and will host friendly matches, including a pre-season match against the San Jose Earthquakes."

The team's first game will be held in February 2017. As we reported earlier this month, the SF Deltas' plans to move into Kezar were unanimously approved by SF Rec and Park, despite the opposition of the Haight Ashbury Neighborhood Council. According to the Guardian, the city received 1,400 letters of support for the proposal and 23 letters of opposition, so overall, it seems that local residents are in favor of the Deltas' plans (which include footing the bill for \$460,000 in renovations to the stadium).

Today's press release contained some new information, including the fact that technology will be part of the experience, "including the use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) Ticketing and Virtual Reality." The Guardian notes that so-called "smart ticketing" could allow fans to move seats from game to game, based on their needs and moods. Visitors will be able to vote on what food trucks they'd like to see at each match, and, on the player side, virtual reality may be incorporated for sharpening goalkeepers' reflexes.



"Today is a great day for Bay Area soccer and sports fans alike," said Deltas CEO Brian Andrés Helmick, who founded the company along with a group of American and Brazilian investors, in the release. "This game—soccer, fútbol, football—is one that unites us all, crossing all boundaries, whether geographical, religious or socioeconomic. Now fans of the world's largest sport will have an opportunity to experience it played at the highest level, right here in the heart of the city."

In case you're wondering, there are no renderings yet available for what Kezar Stadium might look like once it's soccer-ready, but we'll keep fans updated on what they can expect come next February.

# Contra Costa Kops For Kids

## President's Message

Dear Friends and Supporters,

WOW! It's hard to believe Kops For Kids, as an organization, will be celebrating its 20th anniversary on November 13, 2015. I would like to share some historical background information about the organization:

Originally incorporated as a non-profit organization in 1995 under the name Contra Costa Police Athletic Association, its purpose was to host the 1998 California Police Summer Games in our county. Up to that point, the Summer Games were hosted by single large police agencies. Our week-long event was a collaboration of County Police Agencies and the Sheriff's Department.



As is presently the case, the original Board of Directors were comprised of active and retired law enforcement officials.

More than 5,000 California law enforcement officers participated in 66 separate events over a seven-day span. The event was a great success, and after paying expenses approximately \$50,000 remained as income.

Prior Police Agencies who hosted the games routinely donated the remaining funds to their local PAL programs. Neil Stratton, who served as the Executive Director, had the vision to continue the funding level and use the funds to provide educational, athletic and other programs to Contra Costa County youth. Several years ago, we changed the name of the organization to Contra Costa Kops For Kids, which better reflects our mission. I am pleased to report that we continue to honor Neil's vision thanks to a dedicated Board of Directors, part-time staff and the many volunteers who have assisted us through the years.

We traditionally have had two major fundraisers, the Kops For Kids Golf Classic and the Kops For Kids Run/Walk/Wheelchair Races. In October, we partnered for the first time with The 100 Club on a new fundraiser, the "Ride To Remember," which was a 25- and 50-mile bike ride at the Martinez Marina. The purpose was to honor our fallen

County police officers and firefighters. This was very successful, and we hope to make it an annual event.

Finally, to celebrate our 20th anniversary, we will hold a celebration on November 13th at the Concord Police Association facility to thank the many sponsors, organizations and volunteers who have contributed to the success we have achieved.

It's been a great 20 years, and we are looking for 20 more!

# Milton Charles Axt

## Football Player



January 23, 2015

Star on SMJC's first state champion football team (1925); All-League at Santa Clara University; High School Coach of George Seifert and Doug Scovil; Polytechnic High football coach (8 SF championships) & 1953 Calif. High School Coach of the Year.



Milt Axt, who launched his college football career as a San Mateo Junior College player, is a name very familiar among serious fans of San Francisco high school sports. Milt attended Polytechnic High School in San Francisco where he was a star athlete. He then attended SMJC where he was an outstanding halfback on the 1925 football team that won San Mateo's first "state" football championship—for CSM Hall

of Fame Coach Murius McFadden. Milt's contribution to the success of the '25 Bulldogs is significant and he was elected captain for the succeeding year.

After transferring from SMJC, his athletic career and his commitment to education and athletic coaching elevated him above many of his peers and, along with his 2015 Hall of Fame teammate, Al Terremere, helped to connect our modern institution with its illustrious past.

Milt Axt was the captain of the University of Santa Clara football team in 1930 and his outstanding play earned him all-league honors. He also is known as one of the top baseball catchers in Santa Clara Bronco history.

Milt Axt's enduring reputation was built as an educator and football coach. He first coached at the Belmont School for Boys in 1931 and then at Petaluma High School, where his teams lost only seven games in as many years.

In 1942, Axt joined the faculty at Polytechnic High School, his alma mater. During World War II, he was assigned to different high schools to help resolve the shortage of teachers. During a short stint at Lowell High, Coach Axt was an assistant football coach and 2015 CSM Hall of Fame inductee Doug Scovil was one of the school's players.

## College of San Mateo

State Coaches Association and has been inducted into its hall of fame as well as the San Francisco Prep Hall of Fame.

Milt Axt coached many student athletes who moved on from Poly including future San Francisco 49ers head coach George Seifert and 49ers players Bob St. Claire and Gary Lewis.

Milt Axt, Jr. continued in his father's tradition as a long-time educator and coach at Lowell High School in San Francisco. Daughter Anita Axt is professor in the College of Liberal Arts at City College of San Francisco.

The outstanding playing and coaching career of Milt Axt has inspired generations of student athletes.

Poly's legendary Coach Axt, is often considered "the greatest coach in San Francisco high school history." He coached his Poly teams to championships in 1944, 1948, 1949, 1951, 1952, 1953, 1955, and 1959. The Poly Parrots did not lose a league game from the middle of the 1949 season until 1954. His peers honored Axt in 1953 as California State High School Coach of the Year. He was active in the

I didn't know he was supposed to go to Cal Poly San Luis Obispo, but a scholarship opened up at the last minute at Utah and it was offered to George. If he had gone to Cal Poly, he might have been on the plane that crashed in 1960, with Al Maranai. Maranai was supposedly being scouted by the Cleveland Browns when they played Bowling Green. Lou Groza was in the stands. I also didn't realize that Joe Scudero who was on undefeated USF 51 team, also played at Poly.






